Information about our use of cookies

Our websites uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our websites. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our websites and also allows us to improve our sites. By continuing to browse our sites, you are agreeing to our use of cookies.

What are Cookies?

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that we store on your browser or the hard drive of your computer if you agree. Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive with the purpose of customizing content according to user preferences.

What types of Cookies are on our websites?

We use the following cookies:

- **Strictly necessary cookies.** These are first party cookies that are required for the operation of our websites. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our websites, use a shopping cart or make use of online payment services.
- **Analytical/performance cookies.** These are first or third party cookies, which allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our websites when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our websites works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.

You can find more information about the individual cookies we use and the purposes for which we use them in the table below.

Please note that third parties (including, for example, advertising networks and providers of external services like web traffic analysis services) may also use cookies, over which we have no control. These cookies are likely to be analytical/performance cookies or targeting cookies.

Can I block Cookies?

You block cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. By blocking cookies you will still be able to browse our website but certain functionalities will be limited.

How long do Cookies last?

Cookies may expire at the end of a browser session and are deleted after closing the browser. These are called "session cookies". Cookies may also last longer and stay on your hard disk even after closing your browser. These are called "persistent cookies". It is indicated in the table below if the specific cookie is session or persistent cookie. Except for

essential cookies, all cookies will be removed when they are no longer required or they have expired.

Google Analytics Cookies	_gid, _ga, _gat	These are session and persistent cookies Google uses to collect information and report website usage statistics without personally identifying individual visitors to Google. It enables us to estimate our audience size and usage pattern in order to customise our site and provide you with better content.	These are an analytical/performance, third party cookies by Google. Google preferences and advertising cookies	NID, CONSENT	These are session and persistent cookies Google uses to remember your preferences for ad personalisation. It enables Google to select advertising based on what is relevant to a user; to improve reporting on campaign performance; and to avoid showing ads the user has already seen. It enables us to display you Google Maps.	These are functional and targeting, third party cookies by Google.
